The purpose of these awards is to recognize a Land Manager/Officer deemed to have excelled in an area of First Nation Land Management.

CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

Award Categories.

- A Land Manager/Officer who has excelled overall in land management within their community.
- A Land Manager/Officer dedicated to the preservation of Indigenous culture in land management.
- A Land Manager/Officer who has given a lifetime contribution to land management of ten (10) years or more to his/her community.
- A Land Manager who has excelled in land management and has contributed and influenced the field of land management beyond their community.

Entry Criteria. The Nominator must submit:

- Submit the nomination form (page 2 of this document)
- A Nomination Statement describing why you are nominating candidate
- A Biography of the Nominee, and
- Supporting documentation like letters of support, newspaper clippings, website articles, copies of other awards won by the nominee (optional)

The Award recipient will not be construed as an advocate of any political cause or personal agenda, but as a model of excellence in First Nation land management and the appreciation of the First Nation Land Manager/Officer profession.

Awards will be presented during the final day of The Gathering.
